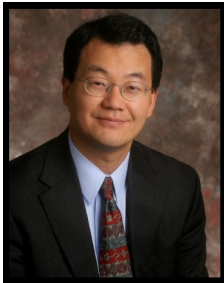

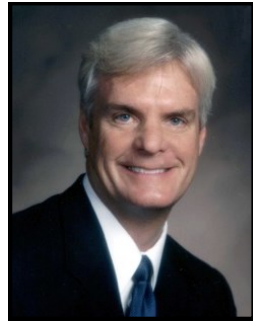

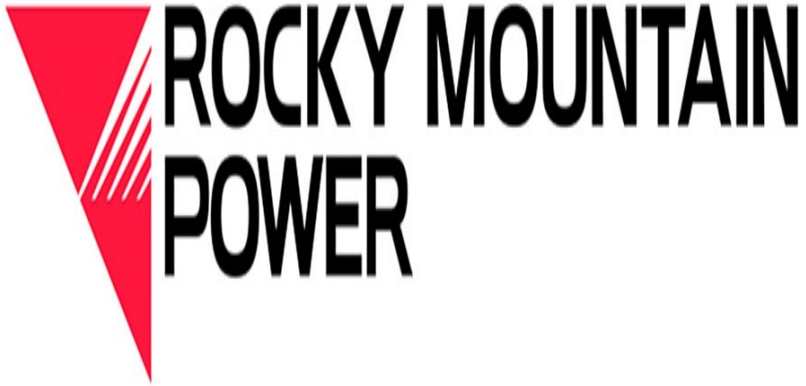

DR. TOMMY AHLQUIST – J. Thomas “Tommy” Ahlquist, III is Chief Operating Officer of Gardner Company, a commercial real estate development company with corporate offices in Boise and Salt Lake City. Gardner Company has recently completed over 1.6 million square feet in the Treasure Valley. Notable projects include: Eighth & Main in downtown Boise, ID, West Valley Medical Complex in Caldwell, ID, St. Luke’s Nampa Medical Plaza in Nampa, ID, St. Luke’s Meridian Ambulatory Center in Meridian, ID, Mace River Ranch in Eagle, ID, The Portico at Meridian in Meridian, ID, and Eagle Island Crossing in Eagle, ID. In early July 2014, Gardner Company broke ground on the new City Center Plaza in downtown Boise. This 372,000 SF project will include a 9-story office and retail building, an underground transit center, and a 5-story expansion building for the Boise Centre. When completed, the center will be the new home of Boise State’s Computer Science dept., the headquarters for Clearwater Analytics, and bring 5 new restaurants to downtown Boise. In 2001, Ahlquist founded Stat Pads LLC, the nation’s premier public access defibrillation management company. The company is headquartered in

Boise and provides service for more than 50,000 AED's around the country. In 2010, Dr. Ahlquist opened a community health clinic, Unity Health Center in Meridian. The clinic is staffed by physician's assistants to provide affordable health care to under-insured working families. Tommy is currently serving on the United Way Treasure Valley Board, the American Heart Association Board, and the State Board of March of Dimes. He is also on the YMCA's Comprehensive Campaign Cabinet, and recently co-founded the Treasure Valley Leadership Alliance. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree in 1992 and Doctor of Medicine degree in 1996 from the University of Utah. He completed a residency in emergency medicine in 1999 at the University of Arizona. Ahlquist is a devoted husband and father. He married his high school sweetheart 25 years ago, and they are the proud parents of four amazing children. LANE BEATTIE – Lane Beattie is the president and chief executive officer of the Salt Lake Chamber, a position he has held since 2003. He can rightly be called “Utah’s business leader.” Under his direction the Chamber has embraced a new era of business leadership that blends the best of a traditional chamber with top-notch and powerful business advocacy. During his tenure at the helm of Utah’s largest and longest-standing statewide business association, the Chamber has strengthened Utah’s economy by investing in transportation, reforming our health system, improving education and expanding international

business. The Chamber was also the driving force behind Downtown Rising, a movement to enhance Utah's Capital City that supported unprecedented investment in Salt Lake City's central business district. Today under Lane's leadership, the Chamber continues to support pro-business policies that will provide enduring benefits for the state economy. A long-term effort to promote prosperity through education and the development of a first-class workforce was launched in 2009. The Chamber has convened the Energy Resources Task Force to conserve energy, develop new sources of energy and preserve low-cost energy that attracts business to our state and benefit all Utahns. Mike Leavitt and played a prominent role in what was called by NBC President Dick Ebersol, "Far and away the most successful Olympics, summer or winter, in history." Along with the many honors and accolades he's received over the years, including an Honorary Doctorate from Utah Valley University in 2008, Lane is a member of the National Advisory Council of the Marriott Business School at Brigham Young University and a recipient of the 2007 Local Distinguished Service award from the American Public Transportation Association. Lane plays an active role on a number of boards. He is the chair of the Rio Tinto Kennecott Land Advisory Board, is a member of the American Chamber of Commerce Executives Board and the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Committee of 100. He was named to the U.S. Chamber board of directors in June, 2011. Lane enjoys golf and skiing, and raises quarter horses. He is a Utah State Quarter Horse Team-Penning Champion. LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR BRAD LITTLE – Brad Little is Idaho's 37th Lieutenant Governor. A native of Emmett in Gem County, Little is a third-generation Idahoan. He has dedicated his life and career to continuing both his family's ranching interests and its history of service to the people of Idaho. A graduate of the University of Idaho, Little has strived to be a good steward of the land as well as a responsible citizen. He has succeeded in both areas by encouraging sustainable agriculture, and by getting involved in public policy. Little served in the Idaho Senate from 2001 to 2009. Little rose quickly into leadership, being elected by his peers as Majority Caucus Chairman in 2003. Little's personal philosophy has been consistent throughout his career: to ensure the lightest possible hand of government in the lives of citizens and businesses alike. A rancher, farmer and industry leader, Little is a former chairman of the Idaho Association of Commerce and Industry (IACI), the Idaho Wool Growers Association, American Land and Resources Foundation, Idaho business Week Foundation, and vice- chairman of the Idaho Community Foundation. He is currently a member of the board of directors of a small Boise-based manufacturing company. He also serves on the State Capitol Commission, the Leadership in Nuclear Energy Commission 2.0 and the Idaho Credit Rating Enhancement Committee. KEYNOTE SPEAKER

GOVERNOR C.L. "BUTCH" OTTER – Governor Otter was recently elected to his third consecutive term as Idaho's Governor. He previously served three terms in Congress representing Idaho's 1st District from 2001 through 2006. Governor Otter is the father of four children and a grandfather of six. He and his wife, Lori, live on their ranch near Star. He was born in Caldwell and graduated from St. Teresa's Academy (now Bishop Kelly High School) in Boise and attended Boise Junior College (now Boise State University) and received a bachelor of arts degree in political science from the College of Idaho in 1967. He served honorably in the Idaho Army National Guard's 116th Armored Cavalry from 1968 to 1973, and later was awarded honorary doctorates from the University of the Philippines and the College of Idaho in Caldwell. Governor Otter's 30-year career in business included membership on the Board of Directors of the J.R. Simplot Company. He also served as Director of the Food Products Division, President of Simplot Livestock and President of Simplot International where he retired in 1993. When he was elected to Congress, Governor Otter was serving his fourth term as Idaho's Lieutenant Governor. He served in that office longer than anyone in Idaho history. He previously represented the people of Canyon County in the Idaho House of

Representatives for two terms from 1973 to 1976 and, was on the Idaho Republican Party Central Committee. Governor Otter is a member of the Roman Catholic Church, the National Rifle Association, the Maple Grove State Grange, the Idaho Cowboys Association, and the Idaho 4-H Million Dollar Club. He is a Grand Slam member of Ducks Unlimited, a lifetime member of Safari Club International, was elected to the National Cowboy Hall of Fame Board of Directors in Oklahoma City in 1991, and is a lifetime member of American Legion Post 113 in Meridian.
